Biography

Mayor Frank Beveridge was born in Brisbane in 1964 and grew up in a small farming community. In 1979 he moved to Charters Towers to attend high school where he met his future wife, Sharon, whilst completing grade 10. He later went on to complete a mechanic apprenticeship at Peters Holden and then worked for eight years at the Honda/Yamaha bike shop.

Whilst raising their four children, Mayor Beveridge and his wife have had over 30 years' experience in owning/operating small businesses in Charters Towers and Richmond and have been part of many local community organisations.

With a keen interest in motor sport, Mayor Beveridge spent 25 years racing dirt bikes and still rides regularly for recreation.

Mayor Beveridge is enthusiastic about the Charters Towers Regions' future and is focused on enhancing tourism, attracting investors and improving livability in the region.

With many years' experience in serving Local Government, Mayor Beveridge was first elected to the former Charters Towers City Council in 2000 and served three terms as Councillor and one as Deputy Mayor. He later went on to serve as Mayor from 2012-16 and was most recently elected as Mayor for a second term in April 2020.

The Mayor's Role

The Mayor is elected as a representative of the council area as a whole at the general elections (for a term of four years).

The Mayor is ex-officio of all portfolios, however is allocated the Advocacy portfolio as official spokesperson for Council.

In addition to representing the region and the people who live in it, the Mayor has special duties such as running council meetings.
