NEW RAMP TO ROTARY LOOKOUT

A new disability access ramp has improved access to Buckland's Hill and the Rotary Lookout.

Local contractor Cantle Building Pty Ltd won the tender to carry out the work to build the new ramp.

A full-length ramp replaces the steps and steep embankment to make access easier for people who have difficulty walking or are in a wheelchair to use the lookout.

The improvements also lower the risk for Council's Infrastructure Services team when maintaining the site.

Money for the project has come from the state government's Works for Queensland (W4Q) program which supports regional councils to undertake minor infrastructure projects.

PARVOVIRUS OUTBREAK

ouncil is continuing to urge dog owners to continue to exercise caution amidst a Parvovirus outbreak in the region.

Also known as Parvo, it is a highly infectious virus that attacks the gastrointestinal tract and cardiovascular systems of dogs.

The main source of the virus is the faeces of infected dogs so is easily transmitted.

To help limit the spread, owners are encouraged to have their dogs vaccinated using one of our local veterinary clinics; ensure their dogs are not wandering outside their yards; avoid taking dogs to public spaces such as dog parks, or socialising their dogs with other dogs unless they are vaccinated.

If your dog begins to show symptoms such as bloody diarrhoea; a strong faeces odour; clear foamy yellow bile vomit; unwillingness to eat, and weight loss; and dehydration leading to increased water intake, lethargy and weakness, contact your vet.



Council's Water and Wastewater team continue to work through several projects, as outlined in the 2020/21 Operational Plan, to improve water security and help attract more development potential to the Charters Towers Region. GREENVALE

A new radar planned for Greenvale will help deliver more timely and accurate weather information to the Bureau of Meteorology.

The radar is one of four that the federal government will install in Queensland to fill significant coverage gaps.

Once installed, it will provide improved rainfall rate measurement for use in flood warning operations; more accurate information of accumulated rainfall and stored soil moisture; better short-term forecasting of rainfall and severe weather; and better tracking of location and strength of wind change.

The new radar is scheduled to be installed later this year.

PARADISE STREET / RACECOURSE ROAD UPDATE The bulk of the major construction work at the Racecourse Road and Paradise Street interrection is now complete. These works

and Paradise Street intersection is now complete. These works will improve safety for pedestrians and motorists while increasing parking spaces for nearby businesses.

Works have begun to install a roundabout at the corner of Racecourse Road and Peek Street - both high vehicle traffic urban roads - to increase safety by reducing accidents. Pedestrian access will also be improved with pedestrian refuges located in the central traffic islands.





Things have kicked off from where they finished last year for the Dalrymple Saleyards. It's been a big start to 2021 for the facility and it's on track to record its highest number of sales during a financial year.

Over the next few months Council will be making some exciting announcements based on the facility. Watch this space.

THE HURRICANE LAMP

At the centre piece of the brand is the hurricane lamp that the viewer can interpret in three ways:

- as a beacon signalling visitors to come and seek out their own story and connection:
- as a symbol of all the experiences the outback has to offer; to go camping with your family, to float downstream in a river, to be surrounded in our picturesque landscapes and soak in the rays of our sunsets: and
- as an ode to the pioneers who built this region as part of our rich 19th Century history.

This iconic symbol has also been chosen to reflect the research undertaken that indicates there are two prominent types of visitors that are drawn to our region:

- people seeking an outback adventure - camping, fishing and exploring; and
- people wanting to discover and connect with the past; learn more about the days of "Gold Fever;" admire the grand architectural feats that line the streets; relive the bygone era of the WWII war effort; or seek out their ancestry.

On closer inspection of the words you can see a rough, almost dirt like texture designed to evoke connotations of the hard work and true grit of our primary producers and our strong connection to the beef and cattle industry.

This also complements the Region's rich mining industry.

UNEARTH OUR SECRETS

This tagline encapsulates a sense of mystery to the traveller and visitor attempting to seek out their own story.

The Charters Towers Region has played many significant and important roles throughout Australian history from the pioneer mining days of the Gold Rush to the Allied Forces war effort, relics of yesteryear fill our communities and exude mysteries of times past beckoning travelers to explore and uncover the secrets

The subliminal messaging "Unearth Our Secrets" is also one of selfdiscovery and adventure.





Council is continuing its proactive approach to natural disaster management. 

LEST WE FORGET

YOUTH COUNCIL FIRST MEETING FOR 2021

On what is a momentous occasion for the community, the Charters Towers Youth Council came together for the first meeting of 2021.

The Youth Council, comprising of two Grade 11 students from each of Charters Towers' high schools met on Friday, 19 March 2021 at the Charters Towers Regional Council Administration Centre.

As part of an induction, the students were provided with an overview of local government by Deputy Mayor, Cr Sonia Bennetto and Council's Chief Executive Officer, Aaron Johansson, before visiting the Charters Towers Water Treatment Plant.

Cr Sonia Bennetto said this site visit will help the Youth Council members form a good picture of what local government is all about and link the service with the infrastructure.

At the Water Treatment Plant the students were shown how water quality is monitored, visited the lab where water quality testing is undertaken and led through the treatment modules where raw water is processed before it is supplied to the community of Charters Towers.

Feedback from the Youth Council revealed an appreciation of the work the Water Treatment Plant



operators do to ensure the community receives quality water supply.

Mayor Frank Beveridge, who is also Chair of the Youth Council, said the main aim of the first meeting was to provide students with an introduction on how Council services the community.

"During their first meeting, the Youth Council were taken through the most recent General Meeting of Council as well as given an overview of how a Council meeting is run," he said.

"With a couple of major community projects coming up over the next 12 months, Deputy Mayor Sonia Bennetto and I both agree the community will benefit from the perspective of the Youth Council, as this is a niche view that is under-represented in the community."


Cr Sonia Bennetto encouraged students to seek input from beyond their school groups and seek the view of their social groups.
