1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant policies that have been adopted in the preparation of these Financial Statements are:

(a) Basis of Preparation

This general purpose financial report has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards and complies with the requirements of the Local Government Act 1993 and the Local Government Finance Standard 2005.

Under the provisions of the *Local Government Reform Act 2007*, Dalrymple Shire Council was abolished at midnight on 14 March 2008. All the council's business, including all assets and liabilities were transferred to the Charters Towers Regional Council (CTRC) immediately before change over day at the values reported in these financial statements in accordance with the Local Government Reform Implementation Regulation 2008. Dalrymple Shire Council is, therefore, not a going concern.

Even though Dalrymple Shire Council is not a going concern the basis of preparation of these financial statements is consistent with the going concern basis because of the way in which the Council's assets have been transferred.

(b) Statement of Compliance

Australian Accounting Standards include Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS). Because the Council is a not-for-profit entity and the Australian Accounting Standards include requirements for not-for-profit entities which are inconsistent with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), to the extent these inconsistencies are applied this Report does not comply with IFRS. The main impact is in the offsetting of revaluation and impairment gains and losses within a class of assets.

The period covered by this financial report is from 1 July 2007 to 14 March 2008 (comparative year 1 July 2006 to 30 June 2007), which is in accordance with Local Government Finance Standard 2005, Section 27.

Comparative figures for the preceding financial year have been reclassified, where necessary, on a basis consistent with current financial year disclosures.

Except where otherwise stated the financial report has been prepared in accordance with the historical cost basis.

(c) Accounting Policies

AASB7 applies for the first time this year. This standard relates to the presentation of information and does not impact on the result or position disclosed.

Otherwise accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year, unless specified in specific notes.

(d) Currency

Dalrymple Shire Council uses the Australian Dollar as its functional currency and its presentation currency.

(e) Constitution

Dalrymple Shire Council is constituted under the Queensland Local Government Act 1993 and is domiciled in Australia.

(f) Cessation of Council

Under the provisions of the *Local Government Reform Act 2007*, Dalrymple Shire Council was abolished at midnight on 14 March 2008. All the council's business, including all assets and liabilities were transferred to the Charters Towers Regional Council (CTRC) immediately before change over day at the values reported in these financial statements in accordance with the Local Government Reform Implementation Regulation 2008.

(g) Date of Authorisation

The financial report was authorised for issue on the date it was submitted to the Auditors for issue until the adoption of the report by the Local Government as part of the Annual Report. The Local Government has the power to amend the financial report after it is authorised for issue until the adoption of the report by the Local Government as part of the Annual Report.

(h) The Local Government Reporting Entity

All funds through which the local government controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this financial report.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those funds (example, loans and transfers between funds) have been eliminated in full.

Funds that cannot be used for council purposes are trust funds held for outside parties, and are not included in this report.

(i) Taxation

Income of local authorities and public authorities is exempt from Commonwealth taxation except for Fringe Benefits Tax and Goods and Services Tax (GST). As such, input tax credits receivable and GST payable from/to the Australian Taxation Office are recognised and accrued.

For the period ended 14 March 2008

(j) Trust Funds held for outside parties

Funds held in the Trust Account on behalf of outside parties include security deposits lodged to guarantee performance and unclaimed monies paid into the Trust Account by the Council. The Council performs only a custodian role in respect of these monies and because they cannot be used for Council purposes they are not considered revenue nor brought to account in the financial statements. Details of monies held in the Trust Account as at 14 March 2008 are as follows:

(ii) Capital and Operating Expenditure

As a general rule, material expenditure incurred for the acquisition or development of assets is capital expenditure. Expenditure necessarily incurred in either maintaining the operational capacity of the non-current asset or ensuring that the original life estimate is achieved, is considered maintenance expenditure and is treated as an expense as incurred.

(iii) Acquisitions of Assets

Acquisitions of Assets are initially recorded at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition, including all costs incurred in getting the assets ready for use.

Non-monetary assets, including property, plant and equipment, received in the form of grants or contributions are recognised as assets and revenues at fair value by Council valuation.

(iv) Valuation

Non-current assets recognised, other than minor plant and equipment, receivables and investments are valued at fair value.

For the period ended 14 March 2008

Fair value is the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable, willing parties in an arm's length transaction.

The carrying amount of the asset is the amount at which an asset is recognised after deducting any accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

Land, buildings, infrastructure and heritage and cultural assets are measured on the revaluation basis, at fair value, in accordance with AASB116 *Property, Plant and Equipment* and the *Local Government Finance Standard 2005*. All other non-current assets, principally plant and equipment and intangibles, are measured at cost.

Non-current physical assets measured at fair value are revalued where required so that the carrying amount of each class of asset does not materially differ from its fair value at the reporting date. This revaluation may involve the application of a suitable index to the cost elements of each asset, or may involve an independent assessment of the value. Only those assets, the total values of which are material, compared to the value of the class of assets to which they belong, are comprehensively revalued.

Details of valuers and methods of valuation are disclosed in Note 15(b).

As part of the transition to the Australian Equivalent of International Financial Reporting Standards (AEIFRS) the *Local Government Finance Standard* was amended in *2005* to include the following provision:

Section 45 – Valuation of Non-current Assets

Subsection 5 - Major Plant or Equipment, for a local government, means Plant or Equipment that is-

- (a) Of a type that is considered to be of high value to the local government within the meaning of the policy prepared by the local government for this section; and
- (b) Prone to a high degree of price fluctuation or in danger of becoming obsolete.

In accordance with this standard, Major Plant was categorised as a separate class of asset for reporting purposes, these assets were are to recognised at fair value basis (written down current replacement cost).

Dalrymple Shire Council at the meeting of the 28 June 2007 resolved to adopt the Major Plant Policy, which included the following provision:

It is the policy of Dalrymple Shire Council that only plant and equipment that has a cost of greater than \$1,000,000 is considered to be of a high value for the purposes of defining Major Plant.

As a consequence, plant and equipment with a cost less than or equal to \$1,000,000 is valued at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Cost is the amount of cash or cash equivalents paid or the fair value of the other consideration given to acquire an asset at the time of its acquisition or construction or, where applicable, the amount attributed to that asset when initially recognised in accordance with the specific requirements of other Australian Accounting Standards.

In the previous years only plant and equipment with a useful life of 10 years or less or current replacement cost of less than \$50,000 were shown in the accounts at cost less accumulated depreciation (S36 Local Government Finance Standard 1994).

For the period ended 14 March 2008

(v) Depreciation of Property, Plant and Equipment

To achieve a systematic and rational allocation of the value of non-current assets over their estimated useful lives, depreciation represents the consumption of the service potential embodied in the non-current asset over its useful life. The straight line method of depreciation is used. Estimated useful life of assets is reviewed periodically and range between the following useful lives:

Assets are depreciated from the date of acquisition or, in respect of internally constructed assets, from the time an asset is completed and commissioned.

(vi) Unfunded Depreciation

Funded Depreciation is defined as the amount of depreciation in a financial year that is paid for by revenue raised during the year.

Unfunded Depreciation is defined as the amount of depreciation in a financial year that is not paid for by revenue raised during the year.

Council has reported an amount of \$206,263.86 (\$260,206.61 for the year ended 30 June 2007) as unfunded depreciation in the financial statements for the following reasons:

Traditionally, the construction and/or acquisition of following assets have been financed by a combination of means other than accumulated depreciation funds, namely general revenue, loan borrowings, capital grants, subsidies, donations and/or reserves. With this in mind Council believes it is reasonable to assume that a similar combination of funding sources will be utilised to fund the ultimate replacement, renewal or refurbishment of these facilities.

- Shire Administration Complex
- Saleyards Complex
- Workshop Complex
- Road-making Plant Scrapers
- Dalrymple Villa Complex

The unfunded depreciation amount reported by Council is the depreciation recorded in relation to the above assets for the current financial year as in Council's financial statements.

(vii) Impairment

All property, plant and equipment, intangible assets and investment property are examined annually to determine whether there is any need to consider impairment.

For the period ended 14 March 2008

Impairment is also considered annually for intangible assets with an intangible useful life.

(I) Non Current Assets Constructed by the Local Government, including Capital Work in Progress

The cost of non-current assets constructed by the local government includes the cost of all materials used in construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

(m) Inventories

Stores, raw materials and water held for resale are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value and include, where applicable, direct material, direct labour and an appropriate portion of variable and fixed overheads. Costs are assigned on the basis of weighted average cost.

Inventories held for distribution are:

- Goods to be supplied at no, or nominal, charge, and
- Goods to be used for the provision of services at no, or nominal, charge.

These goods are valued at the lower of cost and replacement cost.

(n) Investments

Investments are brought to account at net fair value. Net fair value is the amount of cash expected to be received from the settlement of transactions at reporting date.

Investments are placed with approved financial institutions in accordance with the terms set within the *Statutory Bodies Financial Arrangements Act 1982*. Investments are generally term deposits, commercial bills or similar instruments of less than 180 days to maturity. Investments are placed utilising prevailing market rates of return.

(o) Land Held for Resale

Land approved for resale is recorded as part of the Council's inventory assets and are valued at lower of cost or net market value based on current market prices of undeveloped land in the vicinity, or in a similar area, having similar characteristics of the land held, at the time the land development is proposed and approved by Council.

Profit arising upon sale of land is recognised in the Income Statement on the signing of a valid unconditional contract of sale.

(p) Interest

Interest income is recognised as it accrues.

(q) Trade and other payables - Employee Benefits

Employee benefits are accrued for such items as wages and salaries, annual leave and long service leave in respect of service provided by the employee up to the reporting date. Liabilities for benefits are assessed at each reporting date. Sick leave taken in the future will be met by future benefits.

(i) Wages and Salaries

A liability for wages and salaries is recognised, and is measured as the amount unpaid at balance date at current pay rates in respect of employees' services up to that date.

For the period ended 14 March 2008

(ii) Annual Leave

A liability for annual leave is recognised. The current portion is based on current wage and salary levels and includes employee on-costs. The non-current portion is based on projected future wage and salary levels and related employee on-costs discounted to present values. This liability is treated as a payable and not as a provision.

(iii) Long Service Leave

A liability for long service leave is measured as the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date. The interest rates attaching, as at the reporting date, to Commonwealth Government guaranteed securities are used to discount the estimated future cash outflows to their present value. The value of the liability was calculated using current pay rates and projected future increases in those rates and includes related employee on-costs.

The current portion is based on previous long service leave patterns of expenditure. The non-current portion is based on projected future wage and salary levels and related employee on-costs discounted to present values. This liability is treated as a payable and not as a provision.

(iv) Superannuation

The superannuation expense for the reporting period is the amount of the statutory contribution the local government makes to the superannuation plan that provides benefits to its employees. Details of those arrangements are set out in note 23.

(v) Sick Leave

No liability for sick leave is recognised in the accounts. Council has no accumulated sick leave liability as it is paid for when then leave is taken.

(r) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables are recognised initially at fair value due at the time of sale or service delivery and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Settlement of these amounts is required within 30 days from invoice date.

The collectability of receivables is assessed periodically and if there is objective evidence that Council will not be able to collect all amounts due, the carrying amount is reduced with provision being made for impairment. The loss is recognised in other expenses.

The amount of the provision is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of the estimated cash flows, discounted at the effective interest rate. Increases in the provision for impairment are based on loss events.

All known bad debts were written-off against the provision for impairment at 14 March 2008. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off are credited against other expenses in the income statement.

Loans and advances are recognised in the same way as other receivables. Terms are usually a maximum of five years with interest charged at commercial rates. Security is not normally obtained.

(s) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions. Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier,

For the period ended 14 March 2008

upon receipt of the rates. Control over granted assets is normally obtained upon their receipt or upon notification that a grant has been secured.

In respect of uncollected rates, provision is made for amounts considered not collectible.

Where contributions recognised as revenue during the reporting period are obtained on the condition that they be expended in a particular manner or used over a particular period, and those conditions were undischarged as at the reporting date, the nature of and amounts pertaining to those undischarged conditions are disclosed in Note 4.

(t) Trade and other payables

Creditors have been recognised as a liability for the year ended 14 March 2008 at the time the amount owed can be measured reliably and when it is probable the account will have to be paid. A liability is recognised upon receipt of goods and services and receipt and acceptance of related invoices. The amount recognised for each creditor is based on purchase or contract costs. The amounts are unsecured and are normally settled within 30 working days.

(u) Borrowings

Loans and borrowings have been recognised as a liability for the year ended 14 March 2008 at their book value.

(v) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and Deposits are recognised upon deposit of funds with a recognised financial institution. They are measured at the value upon deposit of the funds.

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand, cash at bank, on-call deposits and investments, which are readily convertible to cash on hand and which are used in the cash management function on a day-to-day basis, net of any outstanding bank overdraft.

(w) Land deemed not to have a value (Local Government Finance Standard 2005 Section 46)

The following do not have a value for the purposes of Dalrymple Shire Council's financial statements –

- a) Land that is a reserve under the *Land Act 1994* and is controlled by Dalrymple Shire Council, and
- b) Land under roads controlled (but not owned) by Dalrymple Shire Council.

The total area of reserves referred to in (a): 14 March 2008 - 16,225 hectares (30 June 2007 - 16,225 hectares).

(x) Components of Equity

(i) Capital

Taken together these accounts represent the amount of wealth currently required and in use by the Council for its operations and to maintain its conventional assets and infrastructure at existing levels of operating capability.

(a) Asset Revaluation Reserve

The Asset Revaluation Reserve is comprised of adjustments relating to changes in value of items which arise primarily from changes in the purchasing power of money, including restatements of non-monetary assets. This reserve is not a true reserve which represents money allocated for specific purposes but represents the changes in the capital of the Council.

(b) Capital Account

This account holds the initial capital of the Council as at the implementation of accrual accounting together with any additions or reductions.

(ii) Other Reserves

These reserves represent wealth that is accumulated within the Council to meet specific future needs. In each case the amount relates to a perceived requirement which is not currently a liability.

(a) Future Capital Works Reserve

This reserve was created to provide funds for future capital works.

(b) Information Technology Reserve

This reserve was created to provide funds for future upgrading and or development of information technology systems hardware, software and/or resources.

(c) Long Service Leave Reserve

This reserve is created to provide cash funds to meet future long service leave commitments.

(iii) Accumulated Surplus

This represents the amount of Council's net wealth that is not required to meet the immediate requirements or to meet specific future needs. The balance of this account at the end of each financial year shows the amount available to be offset against expenditure in the following financial year or, if a deficit, the additional amount of revenue needed to be raised in the following year.

(aa) Financial Risk Management

Council minimises its exposure to financial risk in the following ways:

Investments in financial assets are only made where those assets are with a bank or other financial institution in Australia and are for a period of less than one year.

Council does not invest in derivatives or other risk investments.

When Council borrows, it borrows from the Queensland Treasury Corporation unless another financial institution can offer a more beneficial rate, taking into account any risk.

(ab) Judgements and Assumptions

Council has made no judgements or assessments which may cause a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next reporting period.

20. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Dalrymple Shire Council is a member of the local government self-insurance scheme, Local Government Workcare. Under this scheme the Council has provided a bank guarantee to cover bad debts which may remain should the self-insurance licence be cancelled because of insufficient funds being available to cover outstanding liabilities. Only Local Government Workcare may call on any part of the guarantee should the above circumstances arise.

The Council's maximum exposure is: \$163,729.50.

Dalrymple Shire Council is a member of the local government mutual liability self-insurance pool, LGM Queensland. In the event of the pool being wound up or it is unable to meet its debts as they fall due, the trust deed and rules provide that any accumulated deficit will be met by the individual pool members in the same proportion as their contribution is to the total pool contributions in respect to any year that a deficit arises. As at 30 June 2007 the financial statements reported an accumulated surplus of \$8,309,114.

At 14 March 2008, the financial statement reported an accumulated surplus and it is not anticipated any liability will arise.

23. SUPERANNUATION

The Dalrymple Shire Council contributes to the local government superannuation scheme (the scheme). The scheme has two elements referred to as the defined benefits scheme and the accumulation scheme.

Both of the schemes are defined contribution schemes as defined in the Australian Accounting Standard AASB119 *Employee benefits* Council has no liability to or interest in the scheme other than the payment of the statutory contributions.

Any amount by which either scheme is over or under funded would only affect future benefits and is not an asset or liability of the Council.

Accordingly there is no recognition in the financial statements or any over or under-funding of the scheme.

The audited general purpose financial report of the scheme as at 30 June 2007 (the most recent available) which was not subject to any audit qualification, indicates that the assets of the scheme are sufficient to meet the accrued benefits.

The general purpose financial statements disclose that the most recent actuarial assessment of the scheme was undertaken as at the 30 June 2007. The actuary indicated that without improvements to benefit conditions, or other unanticipated events, current contribution rates would be sufficient to meet members' benefits as they accrue.

The Queensland Local Government Superannuation Board, the trustee of the scheme, advised that the local government superannuation scheme was a complying superannuation scheme for the purpose of the Commonwealth Superannuation Industry (Supervision) legislation.

The amount of superannuation contributions paid by the local government during the reporting period for the benefit of employees was \$434,427.13.

24. EVENTS AFTER BALANCE DATE

There were no material adjusting events after the balance date.

Dalrymple Shire Council ceased to exist immediately after 14 March 2008 and its assets, liabilities and business were transferred to Charters Towers Regional Council. This is not considered to be an adjusting event as it does not impact on Dalrymple Shire Council immediately before the transfer.

The transfer to Charters Towers Regional Council does not give rise to any impairment as any change in the use of the assets would be the result of a decision made after the cessation by Charters Towers Regional Council.

(f) Financial Risk Management

Council is exposed to interest rate risk through its borrowings from the Queensland Treasury Corporation and investments held with financial institutions. The risk in borrowing is effectively managed by borrowing from Queensland Treasury Corporation and having access to a mix of fixed and floating funding sources such that the desired interest rate risk exposure can be constructed.

The fair value interest rate risk in other areas is minimal.

The following sensitivity analysis is based on a report similar to that which would be provided to management, depicting the outcome to profit and loss should there be a 1% increase in market interest rates. The calculations assume that the rate would be held constant over the next financial year, with the change occurring at the beginning of that year. It is assumed that interest rates on overdue rates would not change. If the rates decreased by 1% the impact would be equal in amount in the reverse direction.

(h) Credit Risk

Credit risk exposure refers to the situation where Council may incur financial loss as a result of another party to a financial instrument failing to discharge their obligation.

In the case of rate receivables, Council has the power to sell the property to recover any defaulted amounts. In effect this power protects Council against credit risk in the case of these debts.

In other cases Council assesses the credit risk before providing goods or services and applies normal business credit protection procedures to minimise the risk. Council is exposed to credit risk through investments with the Queensland Treasury Corporation (QTC) and deposits held with banks or other financial institutions. The QTC Cash Fund is an asset management portfolio that invests with a wide variety of high credit rating counterparties. Deposits are capital guaranteed. Other investments are held with highly rated/regulated banks and financial institutions and whilst not capital guaranteed, the likelihood of a credit failure is remote.

By the nature of Council operations, there is geographical concentration of risk in Council's area. Because the area is largely agricultural, there is also a concentration in the grazing sector.

The maximum exposure to credit risk at balance date in relation to each class of recognised financial asset is the gross carrying amount of those assets inclusive of any provisions for impairment.

No collateral is held as security relating to the financial assets held by Council.

(i) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk refers to the situation where Council may encounter difficulty in meeting obligations associated with financial liabilities. Council is exposed to liquidity risk through its trading in the normal course of business and borrowings from Queensland Treasury Corporation for capital works.

Council manages its exposure to liquidity risk by maintaining sufficient undrawn facilities, both short and long term, to cater for unexpected volatility in cash flows.
